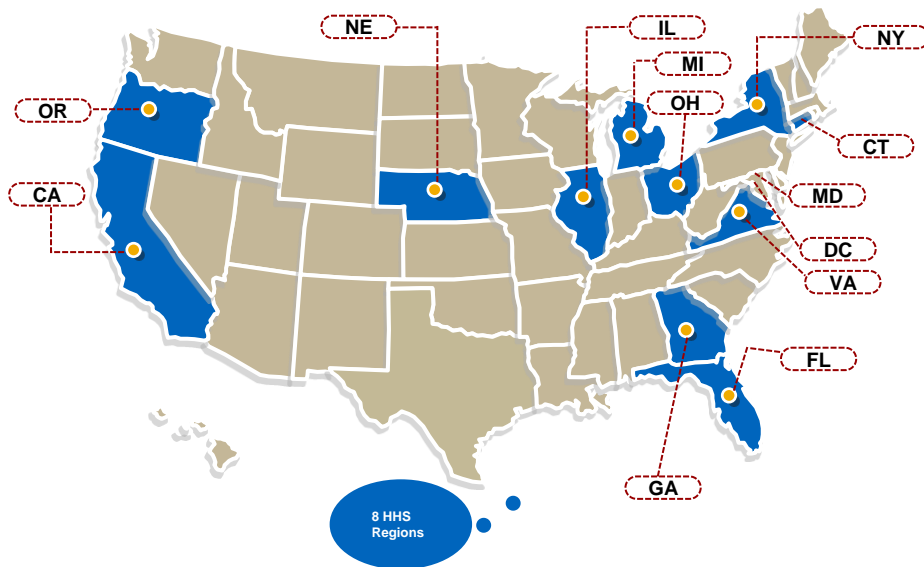


What is the reach of the program?

of students identify as people of color

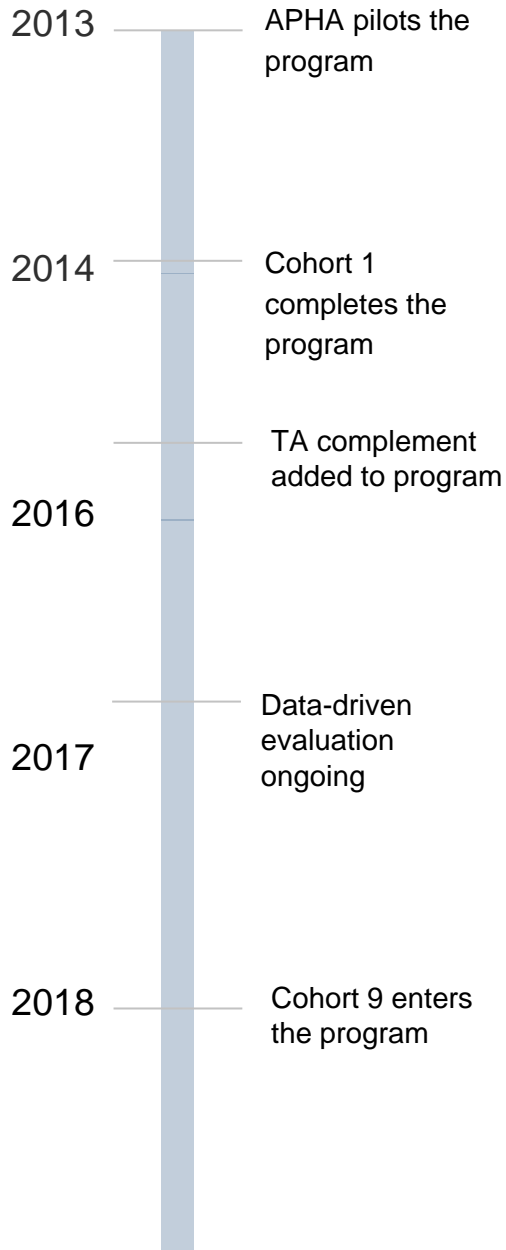
Who has the program impacted?
